

# Biography | Andreas Vogler



(Basel, January 15, 1964), Swiss architect and designer, is a founder of the research and design studio Architecture and Vision. He graduated from the Swiss Federal Institute of Technology in Zurich in 1994. He then collaborated with Richard Horden in London, later becoming his teaching and research assistant at the Technical University of Munich, where he taught semester courses in aerospace architecture and micro architecture.

In 1998 he started his own practice in Munich, working on several architectural competitions. He was a Guest Professor at The Royal Academy of Fine Arts Copenhagen in 2003-2005, where he did research in prefabricated buildings and in 2005-2006, he participated in the Concept House research group at the Delft University of Technology.

He has written several papers on space architecture and technology transfer to architecture for international conferences, and organized the Space Architecture session at the International Conference for Environmental Systems ICES in Rome in 2005.

Vogler has been teaching and lecturing at Hong Kong University, La Sapienza University Rome, ETH Zurich, IUAV Venice and other international universities on Industrial Design and Architecture. He is a member of the Bavarian Chamber of Architects (ByAK), the Deutscher Werkbund, and the American Institute of Aeronautics and Astronautics (AIAA).
