

012 Mobile Clinic


The 'Mobile Clinic' is for emergency use as well as AIDS treatment and prevention in Africa. It allows the stationary treatment of 6-10 patients and ambulant care of many more. Medical instruments and drugs are safely stored in the central unit, which also contains a small bathroom as well as private sleeping quarters for a crew of 2-4 doctors and nurses. The porch with its large stairs is a social platform for preventive education, theatre plays and film projections. It invites people to understand health and hygiene, rather than hiding the ill away from the healthy people.




